

Amòye: Journal of African Philosophy & Studies and is a peer-reviewed journal that focuses on publishing original and well researched articles or book reviews on thematic issues in all areas of African philosophical scholarship. It also aims to publish enlightened scholarly work and research papers in the area of African studies and other topical issues that are related to Africa.

Amòye (which means "the enlightened" in Yoruba) accept articles not previously published or under consideration for publication elsewhere. Submissions are encouraged from authors who have clear notions about how theoretical and methodological considerations can be explored to grapple with contemporary challenges in Africa. Papers submitted to *Amòye* for publication should be high quality essays or review articles written in English language and must avoid reinventing the will; attention should also be given to editorial details as papers that do not conform to the submission guidelines (available on the *Amòye* website) shall not be sent to peer reviewers for editorial considerations. The Editor-in-Chief of *Amòye* is Adebayo A. Ogungbure of the University of Ibadan in Nigeria.

The next edition of *Amòye* will focus on the theme of "Knowledge and Development in Contemporary Africa". Papers and articles are invited from scholars who have clear notions about how theoretical, methodological and epistemological options can be explored to facilitate African development. The works may focus on the following issues (although other epistemic dimensions may be explored): The role of culture to technological advancement in Contemporary Africa, Cultural Epistemology and African Development, Science and the Question of Indigenous Knowledge, The Importance of Indigenous Knowledge to Africa's Development. The deadline for the submissions of papers shall be 27th of October, 2012 and all papers submitted must adhere to the submission guidelines of the journal which is available at: www.amoye-journal.com.
